




**BOARD OF HEALTH POLICY ON FEE COLLECTIONS AND CHARGES**

Government agencies and charitable organizations will not be charged fees for services. Delinquent fees will be charged an additional \$25 per month if not paid. Fees for Environmental Health services may be waived or reduced when, in the opinion of the Environmental Health County Manager, Environmental Health District Director, and District Health Director, the collection of such fees runs contrary to the goals of public health or is a severe financial hardship. A reasonable fee will be collected for search, retrieval, redaction, and production or copying costs for the production of records pursuant to the Georgia Open Records Act. The most economical means reasonably calculated to identify and produce responsive, non excluded documents will be used. In addition to a charge for the search, retrieval, or redaction of records, each environmental health office may charge a fee for the copying of records or data for letter or legalsize documents or, in the case of other documents, the actual cost of producing the copy. In the case of electronic records, the agency may charge the actual cost of the media on which the records or data are produced.
